Who We Are

Oilfield Helping Hands, established in Houston in 2003 as a nonprofit charitable organization, helps oilfield families in financial crisis. Since 2003, the organization has provided more than \$3.2 million (through 2015) to industry workers and their families, and continues to work in the most economical fashion to maximize the funds available to recipients each year. Since our beginning in Houston, we have expanded to establish chapters in Oklahoma, Acadiana, Rocky Mountain, Permian and South Texas and are working toward establishing chapters in other areas of the United States that have an active oilfield community.

We are a group of volunteers who raise funds through donations, corporate memberships and annual fund-raising events. We welcome individual members, volunteers, event sponsors and corporate members to help us continue to be the premier charitable organization for the oilfield community.

History

Oilfield Helping Hands was started in 2003 by several Halliburton Baroid employees in Houston when they organized a sporting clays tournament to benefit a fellow employee whose family savings had been depleted by several serious and expensive surgeries and other medical problems. The event was such a huge success that the group decided to continue their efforts.

OHH registered as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit charitable organization in 2003, and since then has gained momentum as the word spread of the assistance that we provide to our fellow oilfield families. OHH has grown from one small sporting clays tournament that raised over \$24,500 to multiple chapters, each with fund-raising events each year. New members from operator and service companies are encouraged to join us. We have a three-level corporate member program, and we continue to welcome individual members at no cost.

We have chapters in Houston (greater Houston and surrounding counties), Oklahoma (covering the whole state), Acadiana (22 parishes in southern Louisiana) and Rocky Mountain (Colorado, Utah and Wyoming), Permian (west Texas and eastern New Mexico), and South Texas (covering all of south Texas) We are working to expand and open chapters in all areas of the U.S. that have an active oilfield community.

We raise money through corporate memberships, donations and fund-raising events each year. The Houston chapter has five events: fun pistol shoot, spring and fall sporting clays, saltwater fishing tournament and a golf tournament. Oklahoma has a spring golf tourney in Tulsa and a fall clay shoot in Oklahoma City. Acadiana hosts a clay shoot each spring in the Lafayette area. Our Rocky Mountain chapter holds four events each year: OHH Night at Coors Field, spring motor cycle rally, fall sporting clays tourney and Bowling and Billiard Bash in December. Our newest chapters, Permian and South Texas, are in the planning stages for events in 2016.

We have many sponsors for each of the events, who donate money, services and items for door prizes and auctions, so that expenses for each event are kept to the lowest possible amount.

The funds we raise are given, based on need, to members of the oilfield family. In order to qualify for financial assistance, the recipient must live and/or work within the designated territory of the chapters, or work for one of our many Corporate Members. The applicant must be sponsored by an active OHH member, and 75% of the applicant's current income must be derived from the exploration and production side of the oilfield.

This will be accomplished through joint fund-raising events. Distribution of funds will be accomplished through a joint industry committee to assist affected workers and their families.

- Seek donations of product, services and manpower
- Support a frugal work culture
- Recognize our responsibility to help fellow workers
- Continually apply new ideas to generate revenue for OHH
- Maintain integrity in our operations and respect for the people we serve
- Recognize, but for the grace of God, we could ourselves be in a crisis situation

By virtue of our mission and values, Oilfield Helping Hands will be a premier charitable organization for the oilfield community. OHH expects to successfully deliver financial assistance to our fellow workers in financial crisis.

We can only accomplish this with the efforts and participation of our core group. Therefore, we must commit our group to promote a climate of enthusiasm, teamwork and volunteerism.

What We Do

Since the first small sporting clays tournament in Houston in 2003, Oilfield Helping Hands has grown to multiple annual fund-raising events held by each of the chapters. The Houston chapter has five events: pistol shoot, spring sporting clays, saltwater fishing tournament, golf tournament and fall sporting clays. Oklahoma has a spring golf tourney in Tulsa and a fall clay shoot in the Oklahoma City area. Acadiana hosts a clay shoot each spring in the Lafayette area. Our Rocky Mountain chapter is currently hosting four events each year: OHH night at Coors field in May, a motor cycle rally in midsummer, a sporting clay tourney in September, and a Bowling & Billiards Bash in December. Our Permian and South Texas chapters are in the planning stages for their first fund-raising events.

We have sponsors for each of the events, and expenses are kept to the lowest possible amount to maximize the funds that can be awarded to recipients. Through these events and event sponsors, the volunteer efforts of our members and corporate memberships, we have been able to return more than \$3.2 million to recipients since 2003 (through 2015).

OHH is about helping oilfield families in financial crisis. It is about raising money and keeping costs down. It is about feeling good knowing you have helped someone in your immediate oilfield community. It is about having fun.

Supporting OHH

There are many opportunities for individual members and companies to support the mission of Oilfield Helping Hands.
